

WESLEY IS HOME TO

Young Adelaide Voices Adelaide Harmony Choir Metropolitan Musical Theatre Company Monteverdi Singers It is hard to believe that this is, for me, the final pastoral letter for my time as Minister of the Wesley UC, Kent Town. I have thoroughly enjoyed myself as your minister and have been so graciously embraced by the congregation that I feel as if I am part of the woodwork! And what magnificent woodwork it is, in both physical and human terms. So I thank you for the minibage and placeure you have affe



for the privilege and pleasure you have afforded me as your interim minister.

I don't arrive at this point without some sense of misgiving. I'm conscious of things I promoted but never followed through. I'm conscious of needs left unmet. I'm conscious of some things I have not done which I ought to have done. I'm also conscious of the fact that a person in my position almost invariably offends and/or hurts different people in the congregation at different times by what they say or do. So if I have hurt or offended anyone, you have my sincere apology. It was never intentional or malevolent but, on the other hand, I don't believe the pulpit is the place where you only say things that people like to hear. There is an obligation to preach the gospel as one best understands it. Of course a preacher also needs to speak with care and grace and I hope I have done so.

Hugh Latimer, one of the leaders of the Protestant Reformation in England, was appointed a royal chaplain to King Henry VIII (1491-1547). His bold and uncompromising preaching finally brought him into disfavour, and he was subsequently executed. One day, at the beginning of a sermon before the royal court, he exclaimed to himself, "Latimer, Latimer, thou art going to speak before the high and mighty king, Henry VIII, who is able, if he thinks fit, to take thy life away. Be careful what thou sayest. But Latimer, Latimer, remember also thou art about to speak before the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Take heed thou does not displease Him."

I would never claim to be another Hugh Latimer. I have never ascended to those heights. I'm pretty small-fry, really, but the story outlines the obligation of a preacher quite well.

One reason I have written this is to explain a little of my philosophy of preaching. Another is to say that I'm absolutely sure you will extend the same embrace and acceptance to Alex as you have to me and that you will give him the same freedom of the pulpit as you have given me.

I would especially like to record my thanks to all the members of the Church Council. You have been an exceptionally nice bunch of people to work with. Without wanting to get myself into hot water for not naming a whole range of people, I would especially like to thank Mark Symons, Jenny Stewart and Ivan Miller for their wisdom, tolerance of my foibles, hard work and friendship. It is greatly appreciated.

I would also like to express my sincere appreciation to Graham Bell for the constructive and open working relationship we have had in the preparation of church services and other events such as weddings. We both have pretty firm, but sometimes different views, as to what is desirable in a church service but all I can say is, that it has been a real pleasure to work with him and I thank him for that.

Having said all of the above, I'm still your minister until April 30th. I would invite you to share as fully as you can in our services as we approach Easter. The Palm Sunday service will be a musical delight and an enriching time of worship. The Tenebrae meal and service (the meal starts at 7:00pm) on the Tuesday of Holy Week (April 11th) will be a special time of reflection as we journey through the Easter story with Bible readings and hymns. Easter Day (April 16th) will be a joyous celebration of Jesus' resurrection. I look forward to joining with you on these occasions.

HOLY WEEK
