A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Ministerial Meandering

I have just finished reading two books – one I call my bed book because I read it in bed at night, and the other is my WC book because....well I'll leave that one to your imagination!



The first book is a story about ex-Prime Minister Tony

Abbot's fall from grace and replacement by our present PM. The other book tells the story of the rise and fall of Cardinal George Pell from the streets of Ballarat to the basilicas of the Vatican and Rome and then all the way back again.

It would appear that both of these men desired power from a very young age and did all they could to gain power as quickly as possible. In order to gain that power they seem to have been willing to trample over other people on their way up.

Cardinal Pell and ex-PM Tony Abbot both reached as high as is possible in their careers, and then have come crashing down. Mr. Abbot seems to have fallen because he found it very difficult to listen to the advice of people around him – and Cardinal Pell appears to have suffered from the same problem.

It is a characteristic of many people who have reached the highest levels of power in their careers to believe that they alone have absolute knowledge of right and wrong. They also seem to have the ability to find excuses to explain the times when they seem to have got things wrong.

The greatest problem is that for those who wield the sort of power of Prime Ministers and senior Cardinals, when they get things wrong other people are hurt. When Mr. Abbot got tax or employment legislation wrong it was the poor who suffered. When Cardinal Pell looked the other way and allowed a paedophile priest to escape justice it was the weak who suffered.

I have no sympathy for those who have used and abused power given to them and then fallen from grace. The Gospels clearly indicate that Jesus had a preference for the poor and the powerless. Cardinal Pell clearly stands as a Christian 'Prince' of the Church and Mr Abbot constantly claimed to be a Christian. When you make the claim to live by Christian principles then you must be judged by them also....
