Ministerial Meandering

Another gun tragedy in the United States! This time we are told that the man responsible was not that sort of person. However, the police announced that he had nearly 40 guns, explosives and 30000 rounds of ammunition in his home and at the hotel where he did the shooting. It seems to me that he clearly was the sort of person who would do this sort of thing. He had also had the weapons in his room



adapted to fire at a higher rate and with more accuracy than they would have had when they were purchased.

Sometimes it might seem that the world is "going to hell in a handbasket" what with all the other terrible things happening in Africa, South and Central America and in Myanmar (Burma). Not so long ago I was talking with a couple wanting to get married and when we came to talk about their expectations for children they said they did not want to have children with the world the way it is today. That set my mind back to the times when Elaine and I got married in the 1970's when a significant number of our friends refused to have children because of the threat of nuclear war.

It is sad that we feel we need to change the way we live because of the bad things that happen around us. For instance, the crime figures in Australia have generally been falling or staying steady, yet so many (especially older people) feel that they need to take precautions to protect themselves that it changes their lifestyle to the extent that they lose touch with family and friends and the world around them.

I have said many times that the world is essentially good, and so are people. We should not let the tragedies that take place change the fundamental belief that the Universe was created, as the first chapter of Genesis states, to be good. The evidence of this is in the immediate aftermath of these events when we hear of the bravery of people who risked their lives to help others out of the dangerous situation. The media has also shown how ordinary people responded to the tragedy in Las Vegas by standing in huge lines to donate blood, those who have given practical support to the survivors and their loved ones, and the bravery of the "first responders" to the tragedy. This is always what happens after these events.

So let's concentrate on the recognition that, the great majority of good things that happen in society and do not get reported in the media are the reality of human nature, and not the single evil event that fills the media for days on end. The World is good, people are essentially good and as the 60's song said "what the world needs now is love, sweet love." Couldn't have said it better myself!!
