A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Ministerial Meandering

I am just in the process of finishing my latest book. It is a biography of Ned Kelly's mother Ellen. Well, to be completely accurate it is the story of the Kelly family



from their roots in Ireland through till Ellen's death. The book has a lot of photographs I had never seen before, including some very graphic pictures of the remains of Ned's gang who were killed in the shootout at the Glenrowan pub.

I have been very interested in the story of Ned Kelly and his family over the years and I was able to spend some time last year visiting some of the significant sites in the Kelly gang's short but intense history. The site of the shootout at Glenrowan is just a small paddock you would be unlikely to take any notice of unless you knew its significance. It seems strange to me that no effort has been made to turn the site into some sort of museum or visitor information centre.

The other place I visited was the site of the murder of constable Fitzpatrick at Stringybark Creek near Mansfield in the Victorian high country. This place is very interesting to visit as it has a number of information placards describing what happened and where. The visitor can follow the action and stand where Ned, his gang and the police were during the action.

There is a real sense of history at Stringybark Creek and at Glenrowan that gives the person interested in history real chills.

Ned Kelly was a young man of mixed emotions – he could be charming and helpful to people in need, yet if crossed he was a cold blooded killer.



He was a Roman Catholic and after his capture at Glenrowan he spent quite some time with various priests talking about faith but he never expressed regret for the killings of police officers and he went to his death quite unrepentant for much of what he had done. The story is a very interesting one and well worth a bit of time looking in to.
