A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Ministerial Meanderings

I am writing this meandering on New Year's Eve (Hogmanay!) in a motel in Geelong, Victoria. I am attending the 80th birthday celebration for my favourite Aunt Bernice.

Last night as I lay in bed before getting to sleep, I realised that today is the 50th Anniversary of my family's arrival in Adelaide from Scotland. However we didn't leave the ship (MV Fairsea) until New Year's Day. Officially we became Aussies on January 1st 1968. We left Southampton just over a month before and stopped at Las Palmas, Cape Town and Fremantle.

I then thought about the difference between our journey and that of the First Fleet. Eleven sailing ships left Portsmouth on the 13th May, 1787 to start a penal colony on the shores of Australia. On the way they stopped at Rio de Janeiro and Cape Town before finally arriving at Botany Bay.

They went the 'wrong way' across the Atlantic to South America before turning east to sail to Australia. Of course they were following the prevailing winds but it still took nearly a year to get here, the first of the fleet arriving on the 18th January, 1788.

The Rev. Richard Johnson was the first fleet's chaplain. Along with his wife Mary he was expected to bring the Gospel to the rowdy men and women serving sentences in the colony and the marines who were there to guard them.

Johnson had little experience and his job was extremely difficult as his journal and letters show. The Australia founded by these European convicts and their jailers began as a very irreligious society and I think things haven't changed that much over the centuries.

I wish you all a blessed New Year, and may your lives be filled with richness and love in the months to come. Let's also pray for the future life and work of our congregation as custodians of this wonderful building in which our church family exists.

Epiphany

Traditionally observed on January 6th, Epiphany is the celebration of three events that are said to demonstrate the significance of Jesus - that is the divinity of Christ. "Epiphany" means "to show, make known or reveal."

It started in the Eastern Church in AD 361 as a commemoration of

the birth of Christ. Later, additional meanings were added – the visit of the three Magi, Christ's baptism in the Jordan River, and Jesus' first miracle at the wedding in Cana. These three events are central to the definition of Epiphany, and its meaning is drawn from these occurrences.

The Lectionary readings during January focus firstly on the visit of the Magi and the theme of light or being enlightened, and then on Jesus' baptism. The Wise Men were the first Gentiles to publicly recognise the significance of the baby in the manger and offer their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The theme of God's expansive love is prevalent and that this love can and does stretch way beyond our human limits to include those whom we might want to exclude.
