A MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR

For Christians, Easter is the most significant Christian festival of the year. Those who had followed Jesus and placed so much hope in him were devastated by his execution. Those who had enough courage stood by him at the foot of the cross and visited his tomb. They wept for what they had lost in him. If Jesus' death were the end of the story, we may remember him as an inspiring historical leader, but millions of Christians today and through the centuries believe that he rose from the dead and continues to be present to us today. In Jesus' rising, our hopes rise. Light shines in the darkness.

HOLY WEEK SERVICES

With the aid of a power point presentation, we explored the events of the last days of Jesus' life, between his triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane. This prepared us for the Good Friday Service where we remembered Jesus' arrest, trial, torture and eventual crucifixion. On Easter Day we gathered to celebrate the resurrection of Christ and the hope this news brings to the world.
