# A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

#### **Ministerial Meanderings**

In the big winds we had during the last couple of weeks in July we had two trees blow down. One landed on the edge of our roof doing some damage to the guttering, and the water tank which supplies water to our solar water heater.

After the trees were removed by some tree surgeons, the hot water went off and we were unable to do the things we



normally do for a couple of days because the plumbers we use were really busy. It would have been easy just to ring some other plumbing company to come and save the day but I decided to fix it myself. Banned from getting on to ladders by my wife, I was restricted to ferreting around the water tank and the water pump while placed firmly on terra firma.

For two hours I checked this pipe and that nut. I spent ten minutes checking some hoses I found, only to realise that they were connected to the garden taps and sprinkler heads totally separate to the hot water system.

I was now dirty, frustrated and was driven to uttering either epithets or prayer. I chose the latter and said, "Please Lord turn me into a plumber." Clearly this was not a serious attempt to get God to immediately give me the knowledge gained by a plumber over some years as an apprentice. However, as the words left my mouth I happened to see an electric wire leading from the pump and I followed it with my eyes for the first time to the electric outlet on the nearby wall where the plug was dangling uselessly over a nail in the wall. I plugged the lead into the outlet and immediately the pump stuttered into life and it settled into a comfortable purr.

I went inside turned on the hot tap at the sink and lo and behold a stream of piping hot water poured into the basin. I had triumphed! I had asked for the wrong trade, clearly it was an electrician that was required!

Now, I don't for a minute believe that my prayer was responded to and my eyes guided to the offending wire by an act of God. Prayer is a gift to people from God not to be used when we are in need of help in matters like my attempt to fix the hot water system or if we ask for divine help in winning the Lottery. Prayer is the gift of communication with God where we are quiet to listen for God to speak to us, or if we seek the strength and power to get through moments of real difficulty in our lives or in the lives of others.

Too often we speak to God in acts of selfishness or greed. It is in acts of love and compassion that prayer becomes real and powerful in our lives.

The following is an excerpt from Rev Prof Andrew Dutney's reflection on the decision to approve same-sex marriage by the national council of the Uniting Church at the 15th Assembly meeting.

'In my report to the 14th Assembly as the retiring President I said:

God is calling us to be a church which receives its diversity as the precious gift of the Holy Spirit that it is; a foretaste, sign and instrument of "that reconciliation and renewal which is the end in view for the whole creation." Reconciliation doesn't mean everyone being the same. It doesn't mean one version of being human or being Christian replacing all the others. It means people and groups that are different and divided from each other being brought together in Christ to respect, value, trust and serve one another - in all our annoying, embarrassing, frustrating, frightening diversity. That's profoundly challenging. It's sharply counter-cultural. But it is the kind of church God is calling us to be.'
