A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Ministerial Meandering

When we were travelling along the road to Toowoomba to visit our son a couple of weeks ago, we were shocked to see the state of the countryside. Country Queensland and Western New South Wales are under drought conditions



and that was clear as we passed farming land without a tinge of the beautiful deep greens you would expect to see at the end of a normal winter.

The image that was most devastating was not natural, but human. Parked in fallow paddocks next to the road in a number of properties were the large machines used by farmers to plant and harvest their fields. On or near these massive machines (like headers and threshers) were signs like 'for sale – will consider all offers', clearly the owners of the properties are in need of cash for feed for stock or seed for planting. When a farmer is trying to sell his or her major machinery things are really bad.

Another pointer to the difficulties people on the land are facing is the large numbers of stock grazing along the side of the road eating up the grass and weeds growing there for feed. Driving a fairly large vehicle meant there was the need to maintain constant vigilance in case one of the cattle or a sheep panicked and ran on to the road in front of you.

The other thing that caught our attention was the kangaroo carnage left at the side of the road. There were literally hundreds of these animals killed by trucks and cars. I guess this is the inevitable result of modern travel when metal meets muscle and bone. Kangaroos have been designated by the government as pests in certain parts of Australia so some would probably say that the toll of these animals is simply part of the culling process. At least the Wedge Tailed Eagles are happy with the easy food source!

Toowoomba is a beautiful city only an hour or so west of Brisbane. Clean, well planned and filled with beautiful homes and gardens (private and public) it is a place I would be more than happy to live. The city is also interesting to a historian with many places of historical importance. I especially enjoyed the Cobb and Co. museum which has a wide variety of interactive displays and people who are maintaining the crafts that were required in the running of a large horse powered transport company throughout the eastern seaboard (metal workers, carpenters, horse handlers etc.).

I believe implicitly that Australia is the most beautiful place on earth (equal to Scotland!!!!), and if you have the time you should drive to the other capital cities so as to see this land close up and not from 20,000 feet!
