

Pentecost is a period of time during which the Church recalls its faith in the Holy Trinity. It seeks to relate its faith as a people of God to Christ's mission in the world. It commences with Trinity Sunday and concludes with the feast of Christ the King, which this year is on Sunday, November 25th.



A Radical Conversion of the Non-Poor

In the bible, it is coldness of heart, not hate, that is the opposite of love. This is why Dante makes ice, and not fire, represent the lowest pit of hell. Injustice is not a trivial matter. It can wipe out whole races, cultures and whole peoples. To leave justice out of our meaning of love is itself a sin of omission.

Gandhi believed that both nature and society are subject to a single law of justice and unity. The problem in India was that the pursuit of individual salvation through austerities and contemplation could not adapt to the practical needs of society where people were more concerned to escape than to alter conditions of worldly life.

Paul's letters to the Galatians and Ephesians say justification means "making peace" or 'breaking down the wall' between peoples. This brings to mind the Pentecost event, the work of the Holy Spirit, breaking through the confusion among persons.

Justification in Christ is not an individual miracle happening to this person or that person, rather it is the joining together of this person and that person; it is a social event. Jesus calls all persons to reconciliation with themselves and with one another. Jesus frees people from self-hatred and frees them to feel compassion towards themselves, inviting them to love others as they love themselves.

Send justice like dew, you heavens, let the clouds rain it down.
Let the earth open up so salvation will spring up'
Let deliverance too bud forth which I, Yahweh, shall create.
