A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Ministerial Meandering

I can confirm that Easter is on the way!!

The supermarkets have shelf after shelf filled with Easter eggs, and in the attempt to de-Christianise Easter, chocolate rabbits that seem to proliferate even more than real rabbits!

I think we would all agree that Christmas is well on the

way to becoming a non-religious holiday for most Australians. However, it seems to me that it is only in the last few years that the Christian traditions of Easter and the Lenten period preceding it have been undermined and secularised.

In many ways I think this is the fault of the Church itself. The respect for religion that once was part of our tradition in the wider community has dissipated to the point that we are no longer seen as an important ethical and spiritual authority.

The news has just broken that Cardinal Pell, the senior Australian prelate in the Roman church, has been convicted of child sex abuse. Pell had become the Pope's financial fixer within the Vatican Bank and, as such, an important voice in advising Pope Francis on matters of ethics and values. Now we can be relatively sure that this man was involved in harming the lives of young people while proclaiming that those involved in sexual abuse were evil.


We can imagine how those who are opposed to the presence of religious institutions in our society will use this information as ammunition to support their point of view. As we move in to Lent and celebrate the Easter message of the overwhelming love of God for humanity as expressed in the life, death and resurrection of Christ we need to offer a corrective to everything that undermines the power of that message that surrounds us. It is incumbent on us to live our lives morally and ethically and to oppose that which is evil around us.

Now, this does not mean that we become God's police, or that we exclude all enjoyment in our lives, rather we become vocal about our beliefs and whenever we hear someone being critical of the Church, we explain that for every foolish and evil person who exists in the Church (like George Pell) there are thousands who live out their faith in love and compassion (like you).

May you have a blessed Easter and this Lent stay away from the chocolate bunny rabbits!!
