


Perhaps Trevor, Nita, Elaine and I might have some influence on Imogen as she grows up, and she might come with us to church as she gets older.

This will be a service of music and readings for Holy Week organised by Graham Bell. An augmented Wesley choir will present a range of choral pieces. The readings and music together will tell the story from Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his crucifixion.

The **Maundy Thursday Service**, to be held in the **Back Hall**, will follow the Stations of the Cross and contain an abbreviated Passover Seder.

Good Friday and Easter Day services will be held in the church and will also feature special choral music.

Rev Alex Rodgers has graciously agreed to a reduction in time of his placement from 0.7 to 0.5 FTE to help the church's financial position. The chairman Dr Mark Symons spoke about the opportunities presented to us as a church in light of the planned re-invigoration and redevelopment of Kent Town. He also spoke of planned changes in structure of the Uniting Church SA and the proposed change in the number of presbyteries.
