#### A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

### **Ministerial Meandering**

I have been re-reading some of the theology books I used while studying at theological college in Melbourne. Some of the authors were



well known at the time, and a few like Hans Kung and Klaus Westermann wrote books that sold quite well beyond the hallowed walls of university.

Hans Kung in particular wrote two or three best sellers, one of which "Why Priests", was particularly challenging to a young man beginning studying for ordination. Although directed towards those seeking to be ordained as priests in the Roman Church, many of the points made by Kung related just as well to men and women seeking to become Uniting Church Clergy.

In essence Kung argues that it was not Jesus's intention that the Church should have an ordained clergy, but that leadership would be a shared role within its membership. He also argues that priestly power is open to abuse and who can argue against that statement as the events of recent years has made clear.

Then there is the work of Pere Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a Jesuit priest. His writings are quite intense and need a great deal of concentration, but if you stick with them you can discover a window into the glory of nature in which humanity has a place to nurture and protect the natural world rather than to abuse and ravish it.

The latest series of books I have been re-discovering, are written by a German American Theologian named Paul Tillich. Tillich believed that the most dangerous threats to a happy life are stress and anxiety. In his most popular book, "the Courage to be", Tillich challenges us to look within ourselves to find the reality of God. He taught that it is when we touch that reality that we truly become fulfilled and happy. Tillich believed that the purpose of life is to be happy, and that everyone can attain

that happiness by discovering the presence of God within. I have quite a large library of books on Christology (the study of the nature of Jesus), general theology, biblical study, philosophy and Church History in the Minister's Vestry and I would encourage you all to have a browse and if anything takes your interest please feel free to borrow. Just bring it back when you are finished!!

# What is the meaning of Pentecost and the Spirit of Pentecost?



"When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:1-4

Jesus promised the disciples that once He had left them He would send them the Holy Spirit as a helper and a guide. An incredible promise, that when He would no longer be physically among them, the same Spirit that was with Him on earth would come to guide the disciples on the way of truth. On Pentecost that promise was fulfilled and the disciples were filled with this Spirit of power and truth. The tremendous significance of Pentecost is that now that Spirit is available to all who ask; all who obey God. (Acts 5:32) That is the Spirit of Pentecost. In this way God can speak to us.
