ADVENT WREATH

<u>1st CANDLE</u> (purple) - The candle of <u>HOPE</u> (sometimes called the Prophecy Candle. We can have Hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God. (Romans 15:12-13

<u>2nd CANDLE</u> (purple) - The candle of **PEACE**. The prophet Isaiah foretold the coming of a Messiah who would be the Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6).

<u>3rd CANDLE</u> (pink) - The candle of <u>JOY</u> (sometimes called the Shepherd's Candle). The angels sang a message of Joy, "Joy to the world, the Lord is come!" (Luke 2:7-15)

4th CANDLE (purple) – The candle of LOVE. The angels announced the good news of a Saviour. God sent his only Son to earth to save us because he loves us. (John 3:16-17)

<u>5th CANDLE</u> (white) – The CHRIST CANDLE. The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins. His birth was for his death; his death was for our birth. (John 1:29)

He also sang in the choir at St Jude's under the direction of David Clarke. John died as a result of injuries sustained about 3 weeks earlier in a freak car accident. He was flown by helicopter to the Royal Adelaide Hospital where he underwent several surgical procedures and was placed in an induced coma as medical staff worked to try to pull him through, but unfortunately he succumbed to his injuries.
