#### FROM THE MINISTER

Thursday May the 13<sup>th</sup> is a special day in the Christian calendar. The Ascension is perhaps the least celebrated and mysterious of all the "events" of the Jesus Christ story. What is its meaning? How does it fit? That enigmatic last book in the New Testament, the book of Revelation depicts the theatrical backdrop to the Ascension. There we find a story that attempts to convey the ultimate, timeless, eternal significance of the Christ event. It is told as if it were a drama in three acts. Acts one and three take place in the heavenly realm but the middle act takes place on the plane of history.



n this middle earth-bound act Jesus lives as one of us within the limitations of time and space. Not fulfilling any of the expectations of his time, he lived as the truly human one, living and dying to express a profound love for all people, which is his divine mission. His message is absurdly simple. Its core is the gospel Word - which is what? We are truly accepted, really forgiven, can see the created world as essentially good and can trust that the future is open with possibilities. Despite the threat that Jesus was to existing orders, any attempt to kill off his Word was unsuccessful. For the early Christians the crucified-risen Christ was Lord (not Caesar) for in him was the ultimate truth about life. But there is more!

All that is true of Jesus' earthly existence, transcends time and place. The meaning of Jesus as the Messiah is of universal significance, for all time and all people, not just for the early Jewish Christian community. This is the point of the Ascension - how to symbolise universality. Let me refer to Joseph Mathews' article "The Christ of History".

It is like theatre. Jesus in the guise of a lamb has to enter the earth-bound stage and does so heralded by angelic hosts, born of a virgin. (The Caesars when declared divine were also reputed to have been virgin born!) If the play were composed today the advent might well have been by way of a space rocket fired out of nowhere! The important point is that the cosmic figure invades history on a mighty mission. It is not a human invention! When the mission is accomplished, he departs the temporal realm, not, of course, as others do, but through ascending in an effulgence of glory again to the upper level.

This *departure* is the Ascension. In these post-modern times, where we encounter faiths of other traditions telling their story, **our challenge now is** to tell the Jesus Christ story — not as superior religious dogma, but that which is true in our own experience. Our lived testimony to the love which Jesus disclosed is still the only authentic way of proclaiming the glory that the Ascension represents.
