# FROM THE MINISTER REMEMBERING ST FRANCIS

October 4<sup>th</sup> is the feast day of St Francis Day. Among Christendom's saints, Francis of Assisi is my favourite. He became so after I was privileged to be hosted by the Franciscans in the Philippines who supported and ministered to many scattered barrios



(villages) in the in the mountains on the Island of Negros. At that time many peasant Philippino communities were being forced off their ancestral lands to make way for cattle holdings being granted to rich absentee landlords. The Franciscans inspired the people to not only withstand these attempts to disenfranchise them but also to empower them socially, economically and spiritually. Villagers became part of the "base Christian community" movement which drew on liberation theology to interpret the Scriptures and live out a Christian lifestyle.

The servant ministry of the Franciscans seemed to me to be so consistent with

that of St Francis himself. Frances spurned privilege and riches. He loved the natural world and the connectedness of all creation. He had a rare affinity with all animals. He was a peacemaker. He embraced outcasts especially lepers. He "invented" the Nativity Scene. I later learned that St Francis was also a Deacon as he rejected the trappings of the Priestly



caste. That was another good reason to admire him and include him as part of my personal meditative council.

I found the following prayer in a book of readings called "Growing Hope" collected by Neil Paynter of the Iona Community in Scotland. As with the peace prayer of St Francis, this prayer for the 4<sup>th</sup> October captures the Franciscan spirit.

# A FOURFOLD FRANCISCAN BLESSING

May God bless you with discomfort at easy answers, half-truths and superficial relationships, so you may live deep within your heart.

May God bless you with anger at injustice, oppression, and exploitation of people, so that you may work for justice, freedom and peace.

May God bless you with tears to shed for those who suffer from pain, rejection and starvation and war, so that you may reach out your hand to comfort them and to turn their pain into joy.

May God bless you with enough foolishness to believe that you can make a difference in this world, so that you can do what others claim cannot be done.

And the blessing of God, who Creates, Redeems and Sanctifies, be upon you and all you love and pray for this day, and for evermore. Amen

#### MINISTRY AT KENT TOWN


