

A LIGHT SHINING IN THE DARKNESS

With the rising prevalence of the Omicron variant of Covid in our community, many of us may be feeling fearful and vulnerable. This Christmas message from the moderator of the Uniting Church in SA reminds us that Jesus' birth offers us hope of brighter things to come.

JESUS Light of the World

Moderator's Christmas Message 2021

We live and wait in hope and expectation. At the moment

we are waiting for Christmas. Waiting to celebrate the birth of Jesus, the light of the world. Some of us feel we are living in dark times, times that seem to have little to hope for. We remember those we long to be with. We think about those suffering. We think of our world and what is happening to it. And we are not even sure what we are waiting for. The birth of Jesus offers us hope. That glimmer of light at the end of a darkened tunnel. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.' In our waiting, we see glimpses of this light around us. We see it in the eyes of someone comforting a friend who is feeling down. We see it when someone pays forward an extra cup of coffee. We see it when we connect in new and meaningful ways with God, each other and our community. As we can see from afar the houses decorated with twinkling Christmas lights, so can we see the glimmer of hope in the darkness. Anyone who has experienced darkness in their life will know how relentless it can be. But it only takes one candle, a small spark, a flicker of light to bring a glimpse of hope and all the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of one flicker of light. At Christmas, as we celebrate the coming of the One who brings light, may we trust in God who is Lord of the darkness and the light. May we find hope in the baby in the manger who just might be the tiny glimpse of light we need to remind ourselves of where we are, of who we are, of where we are going, of what we may become. May we receive a glimpse of light enough for each step, each breath, each understanding, as we find our way in the dark. May we in turn, give the gift of light to those around us, in turn shining light into the darkness of someone else's world. The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it. As you celebrate Christmas this year, I invite you to look at the Christmas lights on your tree, or those strung up in the front yard as a glimpse of the love and hope which can be found in darkness, a reminder that there can be beauty and hope in the midst of darkness and despair. As Martin Luther King Junior said 'Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that.' May you see a glimpse of the love and hope of Christ in your life this Christmas, and may you in turn share that love and hope with others. Merry Christmas!
