FROM THE MINISTER

Greetings! On behalf of the new Wesley Uniting Church Kent Town ministry team, comprising Pastor Andrew Kieselbach and me, I am pleased to be writing to you on the dawn of a new chapter in the life and history of the Wesley congregation, and also, Prince Alfred College.



It is fitting that the service to mark the beginning of this ministry venture happens to coincide with Pentecost Sunday. In Jewish heritage Pentecost was a harvest festival, the festival of Shavuot. Our own Christian heritage associates it with the descent of the Holy Spirit upon all who had gathered in Jerusalem. Those who had gathered for the festival were said to have been from 'every nation under heaven' (Ch.2 v. 5, NRSV). The story of Pentecost described in Acts 2 is received today with 'a heightened expectation of being renewed and reborn by the power of God's Spirit,' to use the words of Biblical Studies Professor Robert Wall . It is held to be the event that marked the fulfilment of Jesus' promise that God would send the Holy Spirit, and, also, the event that marked the beginning of the Christian Church.

The service on June 5, Pentecost Sunday, at Wesley Kent Town sees the gathering of people from different places — Wesley Kent Town congregation, CityView Uniting Church congregation (where Andrew and his family have been actively involved), Prince Alfred College, and the Synod and Wimala Presbytery. The service will include the commissioning of Andrew Kieselbach (Ministry of Pastor) as Chaplain, Prince Alfred College (0.7 FTE) (2nd placement), where Andrew joins me in chaplaincy. It will also mark and celebrate the commencement of Andrew and me as the Ministry Team for Wesley Kent Town. Together, Andrew and I will share the task of providing ministry (0.5 FTE) to the congregation, in conjunction with our chaplaincy at the College.

There is an underlying foundational connection that exists between Wesley congregation and Prince Alfred College. Prominent members of the then Wesleyan Jubilee Church at Kent Town, along with others from the Adelaide Circuit of the Methodist Conference, were influential in securing the funds and purchasing the land to enable the establishment of a college with Wesleyan connections. For over 100 years Wesley Church was the place of worship for the boarders of Prince Alfred College.

Furthermore, there has been shared ministry between the congregation and the College in the past. In 1960 an arrangement was established which saw the Reverend Rob Davis in placement at Wesley Church and Chaplain to the College. This continued with the Reverend Brian Kelley, at which point it became a threefold placement taking in the College, Wesley congregation, and the administrator of Kingsborough Homes for the Aged. This arrangement continued with the Reverend John Lawrie up until 1977.

I have valued my relationship with Wesley Kent Town in the time I have been College Chaplain and know that my connection with you has been valued. I now look forward to the nature of our connection being drawn closer in and through this ministry arrangement.

I am also aware of the excitement and anticipation within the congregation for what lies ahead. None of us knows what the future will hold. Nevertheless, with the same sense of excitement among those gathered on that Pentecost day described in Acts 2, we are ready to embrace a new beginning in ministry. We know and trust the Spirit of God is with us. Together, congregation and College alike, we look forward to this new chapter with hope and expectation. May the Spirit surprise us in unexpected ways!

He is a qualified Youth Mental Health First Aid Instructor and has just completed another course to qualify as an Instructor of ASIST (Applied Suicide Prevention Intervention Skills Training).

Worker at Banksia Park International High School and School Support Officer working with children with special needs. Andrew has a background in audio technology, is a musician – pianist and singer/songwriter. Andrew and his wife Kelli are currently members of CityView UC congregation.
