

#### FROM THE MINISTER

"So this is Christmas and what have you done? Another year over and a new one just begun."

Every Christmas I've always been struck by this lyric "So this is Christmas, and what have you done?" For many years I heard it in



an accusatory tone, was there anything significant that I had done that made a noticeable difference in the world? I felt guilt and shame. Could I have done more?

As we move into another year, do we bring with us the shame and hurt of past actions, or inaction? Or can we leave them behind? Should we assess a difficult 2022 with all of its challenges and make resolutions for a better 2023? What is the best way forward?

'So this is Christmas' came about after more than two years of peace activism by John Lennon and his wife Yoko Ono. The song was part of an international campaign launched by the couple in December 1969, at the height of the protests against America's involvement in the Vietnam War.

John and Yoko had rented billboard spaces in twelve major cities around the world to send a message of self-responsibility for peace. The message of the campaign was simple, yet powerful at the same time: "WAR IS OVER! If You Want It – Happy Christmas from John & Yoko".



The sole mission was to get everybody's attention

drawn to the fact that war and peace is a personal choice. Lennon explained that they chose the Christmas theme deliberately so that the world could find at least one excuse to choose peace over war this season.

For us today as we celebrate this season, we see Jesus as the source and provider of peace. The birth of Jesus signalled the coming fulfilment of God's promise, and in His death and resurrection we have peace with God. THE WAR IS OVER – If we want it.

Sometimes we get the message wrong. John and Yoko weren't trying to accuse or condemn me, rather they were promoting peace and inclusivity, actively standing against war and division. In a world where issues seem too big for us to do anything about, we forget the power of personal choice.

We can also get the message of Jesus wrong. In John 3:16-17 we read: "For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to be its judge, but to be its saviour".

We often forget that Jesus didn't come to condemn us, but to save us. There is peace between us and God, there is peace to be had with all humanity, if we want it. It's a choice we are given.

May we, as we enter this New Year, act in Love, Joy, Hope and Peace. Amen

Skellon, Kay Rooke and Jenny Stewart, have organised a Special Morning Tea in January to which you are all invited.



## **EPIPHANY**

This month, the church year moves into Epiphany. Epiphany comes from the Greek word *Epiphania* meaning "revelation".





In biblical terms, the word best describes the story of how the Magi or Three Kings - Caspar, (or Kaspar or Gaspar) Melchior and Balthasar - saw a bright star on the night Christ was born and followed it to Bethlehem. There they found the Christ child and

presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The legendary visit would later give rise to the custom of gift giving at Christmas on the Feast of the Epiphany, today traditionally observed on 6<sup>th</sup> January.
