FROM THE MINISTER

With the month of January having passed us by and school now back in full swing, the Christmas and New Year holiday season is well and truly over. It is great to be able to slow down and enjoy a break of sorts, but I am reminded that it takes busyness to appreciate this. I am now well and truly back to being busy!



The first official day back at school for the year for teachers, before the students have returned, starts with an All-Staff Chapel Service. The theme I chose for my reflection on this occasion was 'Inspired by Others, Inspiring Others.' The Bible reading was from Luke 4, verses 14 to 22, where Jesus reads in the synagogue from the scroll of Isaiah,

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' Luke 4:18-19.

The first part of verse 22 states, 'All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth.'

Jesus, then and now, has been and remains an inspiration. What's more, people inspired by Jesus have in their own way been an inspiration to others.

Hanging in the minister's vestry at Wesley Church is a portrait of the Rev. William Taylor, who was the preacher at the opening of the Kent Town Church. It was said to be the preaching of Taylor, a visiting evangelist from California, USA, who inspired Thomas Greaves Waterhouse.

It is said that Waterhouse while quite wealthy was extremely tight with his money. That was until Taylor's preaching not only led to his conversion but also to Waterhouse becoming one of the most liberal donors in the then Wesleyan Methodist Church in Australia. Money from Waterhouse significantly helped towards paying not only the building costs of Wesley Church, but also the purchase of the land upon which Prince Alfred College now stands.

I concluded my staff chapel service homily by asking: what, then, is required of us - of me - of you - so that by giving the best of what we have to give we may flourish within ourselves and that we might be an inspiration to others within this community to which we all belong?

Those of us who attended the first of our Wednesday 'cuppa and conversation' mornings were, no doubt, inspired by the number of people from the local community who attended. Approaching this as an outreach activity to the local community, providing a place where people can gather and connect, who knows what inspiration it may bring in drawing people together!? **May we be both inspired and inspiring.**
