# FROM THE MINISTER ~ Supporting and Serving Others

Following our Service of Harvest Thanksgiving on the last Sunday of last month, I had the privilege and pleasure of taking the many items donated for the occasion to Uniting in Care Salisbury. It was inspiring to see and hear about what they do.



Heartfelt thanks were expressed for our donation. I was asked to report back that it was the largest quantity of items they have received from a single congregation!

Uniting in Care Salisbury was established 27 years ago. It is one of just over a dozen congregation-based UnitingCare Emergency Relief Centres located across the State. Most of these services receive no funding to buy food. They rely on the goodwill and generosity of the community for the donation of food or money so they can keep the shelves stocked. It is heartening to know we have contributed to this.

At Salisbury approximately 80 - 100 people are supported each week with assistance. Their office is open Monday to Thursday 11am - 2pm for emergency relief for those living in the Salisbury Council area. They also run a weekly Wednesday morning tea and offer a free lunch.

Though we are only a small congregation, your generosity in what was provided was not insignificant.

I am reminded of the starfish story. While there are some minor variations in the way it is told, the moral remains the same: everyone can make a difference — even if that difference affects only one person. Here is my own rendering of the story: One day a person was walking along the beach when they noticed a child picking up and gently throwing things into the ocean. Approaching the child they asked, "What are you doing?" The child replied, "Throwing starfish back into the ocean. The surf is up and the tide is going out. If I don't throw them back, they'll die." The person laughed and said, "Do you realize there are miles of miles of beach and hundreds of starfish? You can't make any difference." After listening politely, the child bent down to pick up another starfish and threw it into the surf and then said, "I made a difference to that one."

I am also reminded of the passage from Matthew 25, sometimes referred to as The Sheep and the Goats. (I won't repeat it here. You can look up Matthew 25, verses 31 to 45 to be reminded of this parable of the end times.) I am not inclined to focus on the judgement aspect of the passage (I might say more about that another time). With the boys at PAC I draw the message: Don't do good deeds to be seen, noticed, or rewarded. Do good deeds because it's the good thing to do.

May we each continue to contemplate the things we can do to make a difference. It doesn't have to be something 'big'. Don't underestimate the significance of something seemingly little or small. And, remember, doing can be expressed in words too. A kind word or compliment, or even recognising someone's pain (emotional or physical) can make a difference too! I close with the words I occasionally close with at PAC prep school chapels: May God bless you, and may you be a blessing to others.
