FROM THE MINISTER

Last Saturday my elder son asked if we could ride into the City. We live in the Northeast which means we can follow the Linear Park track from Tea Tree Plaza to the Botanic Gardens. The last time I had done the ride would have been over twenty years ago. In the last few years, I haven't gone riding any great distance, so I knew I had my work cut out for me. We arranged for my wife and younger son to pick us up at the other end. The ride into the city was magnificent. It was a beautiful



day, and though we got lost a couple of times, we remained in good spirits all the way and made it into the city in good time. As we reached the Botanic Gardens, my wife was there waiting with the car..

Then came the time to go home. I started to put the bikes in the car. However, it became clear to me as time went on, that I may have misjudged how much our car could fit in the boot. No amount of pushing and shoving was going to allow both bikes to fit, with seats still available for all four of us in the car. I came upon the uncomfortable and painful truth, that I would have to ride my bike back home.

The track to the city is for the most part, downhill. You do have to pedal, but not expend the energy it takes on the return. I was becoming sore and tired on coming into the city and the prospect of having to ride home again did not appeal, and of course, the way back is uphill much of the way. It was either take two trips into the city, home and back again with the car, or get back on the saddle. So, I made the choice, I went home again on the bike.

This time I was alone, relying on memories over twenty years old to forge my way back home. I took a few wrong paths forcing me to carry the bike up sets of stairs. The pleasant ride in the morning was now a slow painful incline in the heat of the day. I rode through Klemzig Interchange and then through Paradise. I stopped and walked up "the widow maker", a hill just outside the Interchange, which is always exhilarating on the way down, but excruciating on return. A few kilometres on, my legs were like jelly! When I came to a stop, I knew I had done all I could to get close to home. I made the call and was picked up by my family at Hope Valley Reservoir.

Sometimes life can be plain sailing (or riding), and then, things can go sideways quickly. We must make hard decisions and push through. Sometimes it's a struggle just to keep peddling and moving forward. But even in those toughest moments we are not alone.

In this Lenten season we are reminded of the road Jesus chose to travel for our sake. It was a journey that was difficult and painful. He gave up His life for us. He made that choice because He loves us. He never saw it as an inconvenience, but as a necessary sacrifice. He was willing to give His all for us, giving us the chance to be called Sons and Daughters of God. To be His friend, to be His Brother or Sister. At Easter we celebrate a love that knows no bounds, and a gift of relationship with our creator made by the great sacrifice of our King Jesus. Whatever you are facing in this season, may you discover God's amazing love for you anew this Easter, and know His presence and His touch.
