#### FROM THE MINISTER

During the recent school holidays, I spent two weeks in Tasmania supporting two rotations of a national activity for the Australian Army Cadets. (I flew out of Adelaide the afternoon of Easter Sunday following taking the Easter morning service.) School holidays across the country didn't line up to allow everyone to be there at the same time. As a result, the activity was divided into two rotations



to cater for cadets from every State and Territory being able to participate.

The location was Lake Barrington, approximately 40 kms south of Devonport. Specifically, we were at the site of Rowing Tasmania's international-standard rowing course. The scenery was striking. For the first week the weather was picture perfect. The second week was a lot more variable, including wet at times. Due to the Tasmanian mountain landscape, some of the activities in the second week were conducted within the blanket of low-lying cloud.

You might recall years ago the Queenslander tourist advertisements describing the weather in that state as 'beautiful one day, perfect the next!' The Tassies at the activity had their own statement to describe the Tasmanian weather: 'if you don't like it, go away and come back in 5 minutes!' There were certainly moments where it was like this; sun shining through the clouds one moment, and drizzly rain a few minutes later.

Reflecting on this, I thought this is an analogy of life. One moment one's life is heading in a particular direction, picture-perfect, so to speak, and then something happens to the extent that in a matter of minutes one finds oneself in a very different position. The direction is suddenly changed, and circumstances become very bleak.

With this description, is there a Bible story that comes to mind for you? It is very Job-like in my mind.

This change in the outlook of one's life has been the experience of a few individuals I have encountered over the last few weeks. One was, by all accounts, a fit an active person who had a heart attack. No risk factors or warning signs. No family history. A mountain trekker – including the Himalayas no less!

It can happen to anyone; you or me. There may be a story to tell where it has happened that circumstances have significantly changed in a matter of moments.

Belief and faith in God isn't a guarantee of a life free from traumatic, life changing events. Traumatic events can make people question assumptions about their lives, including their spiritual beliefs. The other side of this is that faith and belief can be a source of strength. Both sides of this coin, so to speak, are expressed in the psalms.

What will it be for you?

My prayer for you is that your faith may be your strength to face whatever life may hold, from one moment to the next.

#### HOLY WEEK SERVICES



April was a busy month with special services being held to commemorate holy week, starting with Palm Sunday celebrating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, followed by Good Friday and Easter Day.

#### **PENTECOST**

the liturgical year, ending just before the season of Advent. Pentecost is a Christian holy day that celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit 40 days after Easter. Some Christian

denominations consider it the birthday of the Christian church and celebrate it as such.

#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the Congregation was held following worship on Sunday 16th April. During this



meeting reports were received from the Minister, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman and the budget for 2023 was presented.
