REFLECTIONS ON RESILIENCE: EMBRACING LIFE'S JOURNEY IN 2024

Over the last week I have finished reading one book and started another. The book I finished is entitled 'A scar is also skin: a memoir of stroke, heart attack and remaking' by Ben Mckelvey, published by Hachette Australia, 2023. And I have started reading Eddie



Jaku's 'The Happiest Man on Earth', the story of how a Holocaust survivor found gratitude, kindness and hope in the darkest of places, published by McMillan in 2000.

These books, coupled with a conversation with our friends recently while away, about what hopes and plans we each have for 2024, along with other recent events, had me thinking philosophically about life and time. The transition to a new year is a natural time for reflection. It's also interesting how books can interweave with personal conversations and events to shape our perspective on life.

The central theme of both books is about overcoming adversity and finding joy in life's darkest moments. Both Mckelvey and Jaku provide perspective from their lived experience on the human capacity for recovery and hope.

I have mused over this as I have thought about some of the challenges 2023 brought for myself and the friends I was with, along with some of the tragic and traumatic events that have happened close to home and further afield (and are far from finished when considering the conflict in Ukraine and the Middle East). I continue to think about the family of four who went away, and only three returned home¹.

It may not always be evident, but both the scars and joys of life are integral parts of our personal tapestry. While everyone's journey is unique, there's a common thread of resilience and kindness that binds us all.

The enduring positivity found by Eddie Jaku, a Holocaust survivor, emphasises the long-term impact of attitude on life quality. Ben Mckelvey's memoir of his stroke and heart attack recovery provides insights on the nonlinear nature of healing and growth.

The passage from Matthew 6, verses 28 to 33, comes to mind, although I am continuing to theologise it! And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?

While I have hopes and plans for the year ahead, I know that the year ahead will also come with challenges and difficulties. Things will happen that will come out of the blue, things unexpected and unplanned. That will be the case for all of us.

That said, may your year be filled with growth, gratitude, and the courage to face whatever comes with the wisdom from past experiences and the support of those around you; family and friends. May you look ahead with optimism, faith, and a renewed sense of purpose. *Rev Mark Dickens*
