## FROM THE MINISTER:

This summer season has been particularly unpredictable. The temperature has been going up and down like a rollercoaster. It has been strange to put out the washing only to find it more soaked then when we put it out. I bet the weather people have been pulling their hair out, it's been very eventful. We've had heat and flood, wind and storm, all in the same week!



Life has been eventful too. For me it has been an ending of a season and looking towards a new season beginning. I have just finished my time with CityView Uniting Church, where I have shared being on the core team with my wife Kelli for the last five years. It has been a labour of love, and while there have been many difficult moments, there have also had moments of great joy. I feel privileged to have been able to serve the community there, making deep friendships and I hope, lifelong friends. I am sad to leave.

When we joined CityView we had two boys, seven and three. The building in which we were going to worship hadn't been built yet. I was working as a Chaplain and in Inclusive Education Support at Banksia International High School, and Kelli was just beginning to make plans to do some extra study and return to work as a Naturopath and Nutritionist. Five years later, my boys are thirteen and eight, and I am a dad-taxi for at least four nights a week between basketball and tennis. I am now at Prince Alfred College as Chaplain and serving the people at Wesley Kent Town. Kelli has now been operating a clinic out of Broadview and Marion for over two years, with a fortnightly wellness spot on Life FM. Things have changed.

But, if you asked me five years ago whether I had even a clue where we would be now, it would be a definite no. In life, if there is one thing that is constant, it's change. It's unpredictable and can strike at any moment. Deaths, births, marriage, sickness and divorce. It's been a rollercoaster ride of emotions without even looking at the effects of COVID, the rise of inflation, and war and unrest across the globe. You do wish it would all stop sometimes, but time keeps moving and change keeps happening.

I recently celebrated with a friend who has turned eighty this year. I asked her what wisdom she had gained in the last year. She told me, "Grin and bear it. While there is always difficulty in life, there is also life and joy to follow."

It reminded me of God's promise in Isaiah,

Watch for the new thing I am going to do.
It is happening already—you can see it now!
I will make a road through the wilderness
and give you streams of water there.



Isaiah 43:19

You may be going through a difficult season, but God is always working on something new. God's creation never stops. We may well be in the wilderness, but God is making a road to refreshment, renewal and joy. God is in the process. He is with us and present wherever we find ourselves. Nothing stays the same but God. God never changes and is working on something new. I look forward to seeing what is coming next for our world, church, my family and myself. May we be watchful to see what is happening already, where God may be making a way.
