FROM THE MINISTER

Recently, I attended a beautiful carol service where we rejoiced in the Lord and celebrated the birth of Christ. But, in the midst of that joy, we also paused for a moment of silence - remembering those in Sri Lanka who lost loved ones, homes, and livelihoods in the floods. That moment of reflection brought to my mind the verse in Matthew 23:23, where Jesus reminds us not to neglect “the more important matters of the law - justice, mercy, and faithfulness.”

When I came home, I was burdened with thoughts about the people affected by the floods – not just that flood but also people who are affected by wars across the globe. It is a reality that amidst the celebrations of Christmas, we still have global issues like this.

Today, as we hear about wars and conflicts across the world, and as natural disasters continue to affect numerous lives, we find ourselves living in a tension - the world is hurting, and still, we are entering a season of celebration. Which should receive our attention?

Matthew 23:23 gives us the guidance. “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay the tithe of mint and anise and cummin and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone.” So, we are called to hold both together.

We should not ignore the sufferings of the people around us. We are invited to remember those who are grieving, displaced, or living in fear—whether because of war, floods, or any calamity. As followers of Christ, we are called to show compassion, to stand with the broken-hearted, to pray, to give, and to act with mercy and justice.

At the same time, we must not lose the joy of Christmas.

Because the birth of Jesus is not separate from the world’s pain—it is God’s response to it. Jesus came into a world filled with darkness to bring light, into a world torn by conflict to bring peace. So, we rejoice in the Lord, not by ignoring sufferings, but by bringing his hope into it.

This Christmas, may we celebrate the birth of the Prince of Peace while also carrying in our hearts—and in our actions—the people who are suffering.

“May our joy be compassionate, and may our compassion be rooted in the hope that Christ brings, during this Christmas seasons.” Amen!

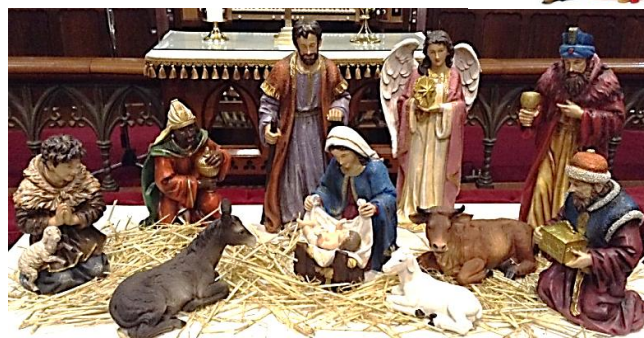
Sunday 21st December, 10.00am
