



LOOKING FORWARD

As we move into the beginning of a new year, we find ourselves in a season of reflection and anticipation. The turning of the calendar offers a natural pause, an opportunity to look back with gratitude and look forward with hope. It is a moment to remember the faithfulness of God through all that has been and to trust in all that is yet to come. Recently, I read some Christmas messages from various church leaders and thought I would share this one with you. It is from Commissioner Miriam Gluyas, Territorial Commander and Chair of the Board of The Salvation Army, Australia Territory. It is entitled, **“The Heart of Christmas”**.



“In a world where hope dwindles, we gather as people of hope.... hope-givers and hope-bringers in a world that needs it in abundance right now.

As we approach this special time of year, we’re reminded once again of the heart of Christmas—God drawing near to us in love. The miracle of Jesus’ birth tells the story of a God who didn’t remain distant, but stepped into our world so we could know Him personally.

In this small, humble beginning—a baby laid in a manger—we find hope. Jesus’ arrival brings the promise of a future held securely in God’s hands, a future shaped not by fear, but by His peace, Prince of Peace, connecting us with God, and offering salvation to all who trust Him.

This beautiful story is wrapped in humility, as the Saviour of the world entered not as a king in a palace but as a child in a stable. It’s a reminder that God often works in quiet places and unexpected ways.

We also see the steady faith of Mary and Joseph—ordinary people who said “yes” to God even when the path was uncertain. Their trust encourages us to lean into God’s plan for our own lives with courage and obedience. And as we celebrate, we’re called to reflect the goodwill woven throughout the Christmas story—to show kindness, compassion, and selfless love to those around us, just as Christ has shown to us.

The world right now needs a whole lot of Christmas... love, hope, humility, courage, goodwill, faith, salvation... a whole lot of Jesus.

May you both know Him and make Him known.

The world desperately needs Him. May we show the way.”

NEW MINISTRY

We are pleased to announce that Rev Dr Jonathan Barker has offered to be our new Interim Minister. His placement with us will commence on 1st February 2026. It will be a 0.5 FTE position and is for a period of 6 months. Jonathan is well known to most of us, having provided supply ministry prior to the commencement of Rev Mark Dickens' and Pastor Andrew Kieselbach's time with us.

Jonathan, a Uniting Church minister, trained at the former Parkin Theological College and the University of Adelaide has served city churches at Pitt Street, Sydney and Pilgrim, Adelaide as well as suburban and regional cities such as Whyalla, Canberra and Goulburn. After living and working in the westside ghetto in Chicago USA, Jonathan developed an emphasis on community development first with the Mowanjum Aboriginal community in the Kimberleys, then in Mumbai, India and later as Senior Community Development Officer with the S.A. Department for Community Welfare. He has advocated for Indigenous Australians as co-convenor for the Aboriginal Reconciliation Council in S.A. and as Assistant Principal of Nungalinya College in Darwin. Jonathan has postgraduate awards from Flinders University, the University of South Australia and a doctorate from the Graduate Theological Union, Berkely, California. In active retirement, Jonathan pursues his interest in history and integrating theological perspectives into current events (among several other things!)

In biblical terms, the word best describes the story of how the Magi or Three Kings - Caspar, (or Kaspar or Gaspar) Melchior and Balthasar - saw a bright star on the night Christ was born and followed it to Bethlehem. There they found the Christ child and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The Feast of the Epiphany, today is traditionally observed on 6th January.
