FROM THE MINISTER

After viewing the Spring season weather reports my son said to me, “this spring is expected to be cooler than normal”. My reaction to that information was ... Oh...! because I didn’t like to hear that the weather in spring was going to be a bit like winter.

It’s natural to feel frustrated when things change from what we’re used to. Some people like winter, others don’t. Each of us has personal preferences regarding different weather conditions. In general, if the weather in a particular season differs from what we expect, we tend to get frustrated. This is a normal human response/reaction not only to the weather conditions but also to real life situations.

Similarly, unexpected changes in life may force us to step out of our comfort zones. In Jesus’ time, people were challenged by the teachings and actions of Jesus because they asked people to follow a different ideology than they were traditionally taught to believe in and were expected to follow.

“Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.” Matthew 5: 17. Jesus often emphasized the spirit behind the law over rigid external observance.

This new ideology was different from the traditional beliefs and practices of the people during Jesus’s time, transforming the way they thought and lived. The reactions of people to this new and different ideology are apparent in the following lines from Matthew 21:23. ‘Jesus entered the temple courts, and, while he was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him. “By what authority are you doing these things?” they asked. “And who gave you this authority?”’

This was the reaction from the religious leaders and the people towards the teachings and the actions of Jesus Christ.

But what we understand from Jesus’ teachings is that Jesus’ new teachings, emphasizing inner righteousness over external rituals, grace over legalism, and love over judgment, challenged the religious, social, and political systems of his time. These confrontations revealed both his divine wisdom and the resistance of those unwilling to change.

The unusual spring weather and our reactions to it remind us to look ahead to summer and consider how we will see God’s presence in the different situations it might bring to us. Amen!
